


# AFRAID?

Do you ever feel afraid? We all do sometimes. But do you let fear keep you from doing what is God's best for you and for others? I'd like to encourage you, "*Do it afraid*!" Someone once said, "*FEAR KNOCKED AT THE DOOR. FAITH ANSWERED AND NO ONE WAS THERE*!" If we think about our lives, all of us have been through difficult times before and have gotten through them, and now is no different. WE'RE STILL HERE!

David took out the giant Goliath, conquered a bear and a lion and affirmed, "**When I am afraid, I will put my trust in God...what can any man do against me** (Psalm 56:4—5)?" He had enough experience with God to know that no matter what, God was with him. The <u>same God</u> that empowered David to perform such heroic feats lives in us today. "If the same Spirit lives in you that raised Jesus from the dead, then He <u>will</u> raise your mortal bodies to life also (Romans 8:11)." God was with David, and He's with us today also.

Are you facing a challenge right now? I cannot think of anyone who isn't! But we don't need to let fears and anxieties take over. If we trust God like David did, then like David we will be confident that God is with to guide and strengthen and protect us—see Psalms 23 and 91. In my house those Psalms are prayed daily. God is *always* at work in our lives not only to get us through to the next thing but to help us to "*Do it afraid*!" One day we suddenly realize that we got through it and we're no longer afraid.

In our Thursday morning Bible Study, we're reminding ourselves weekly of the truths penned by Max Lucado, "You'll get through this." Sometimes our biggest fears can be a hindrance to receiving our greatest blessings. We have an enemy who never wants us to give of ourselves and of our finances because he knows that we **reap what** we sow." I am thankful for your faith, the longevity of Zion Lutheran as a viable ministry in west Medford, and I am confident that "God will not fail to complete what He has begun in you, right up until the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6). I'm praying that God will answer all your prayers in a way that astounds you and all of us, in a way that surpasses all that you could even imagine or even dream of (see Ephesians 3:20 and Psalm 20).

God loves you and so do I!


"Let's Be Thankful" Potluck and Food Drive Sunday, November 9th,

# **Meet new members Richard and Leann Buss!**

Richard and Leann Buss are currently "full-time RV'ers," and new to the Rogue Valley. Both have a great sense of humor and great devotion to the Lord!

Richard was born in Quincy, Illinois and grew up Lutheran with two older siblings on a farm. He says he decided to rebel and got into heavy metal, trouble, and working a lot of different jobs. Now he's "back to his roots-working outside and enjoying traditional worship" after meeting up with Leann. They left Illinois for the west and in 2005 were married at St. Peter Lutheran in Carlsbad, N.M.

Leann also grew up on family farms in the Midwest, as second oldest of thirteen who are now scattered from Florida to Oregon! She has a daughter, twin sons, two grandchildren, and 2 great-grandchildren. After a stroke, Leann had to learn to walk again, but says "nothing can stop you when God is in your life." She enjoyed leaving the corn fields and moving to New Mexico and is now enjoying Richard's dream, living in the northwest—"life is never dull."

#### We Can Do It!

Last January, when I joined Zion's Council, I started looking for ways to generate more income for our church. I was looking 'from without' our congregation. I was wrong. The answer isn't from without, it's from within.

I began comparing 2013 to 2014 in areas of attendance, expenses, and giving. Our attendance has grown by 29% this year over last year AND our expenses have *decreased* by \$615 for that same time period. BUT our monthly giving has decreased by 27%.

I'm not writing this because we need to DO MORE. I'm not writing this to say that if we don't get busy our church won't be here much longer. I'm writing this because I GOT EXCITED when I realized WE CAN DO IT!

Our average monthly attendance is 140 and our average monthly giving is \$33.12 per person. Did you know if we increase our monthly giving by just \$12.72 per person (less than \$4.00 per week!) we can break even. If we were to increase our giving by \$5.00 per week, per person, we would have over \$700. in surplus each month; and an increase of \$6.26 per week, per person, would provide a surplus of more than \$1,400 each month! This is EXCITING!

I want you to know the Lord will bless us if we are obedient unto Him for what is given unto the Lord will be given back to us in greater measure.

The decision was made in June 2010 by the church council to keep all of you informed regarding Zion's financial situation. Total revenues for 2014, through the month of October are \$64,848.62 and our expenses for that same period total \$72,715.92. This leaves a 2014 short-fall through October in the amount of \$7,867.30. All bills are paid current. Money to cover our shortfall is now coming from the endowment fund. We all need to pray about our financial situation and pray that our monthly revenues increase. We all must have faith that our church will survive and remain open far into the future. We are a vital part of our community here in West Medford. God has placed us here for a reason!!!
