

What a Comeback Story!

In recent years we have seen devastating events around the world: floods, hurricanes, snowstorms, random school shootings, terrorist attacks. When we read or hear of the latest disaster, the one that happened yesterday is forgotten with the news of the one that happens today. And the one that happens today will be driven from our minds by what happens tomorrow. Even if the disaster is of record-breaking, biblical proportions, within a short time it is no longer front-page news and becomes just a statistic.

We soon forget that those who lived through whatever the disaster was are still struggling to cope. To take the next breath. To survive financially and physically and emotionally and in every other way. It can be overwhelming to rebuild. From scratch. From nothing into something. The comeback trail can be long and hard and flooded with tears

As we work out the day-to-day process of coming back, we can experience His peace and power and presence and purpose. And, one day, our COMEBACK TRAIL will end at His throne in our Heavenly Home, and we will reign with Him in glory!

Maslow Project

During Worship service on May 18th, a speaker from the Maslow Project will be giving a ten minute talk about what they do in our community. There will be a table set up in the Fireside Room during the potluck and they will have information about their project available and also will be present to answer any questions.

Zion will also be holding a school supply (and other needed items as well) drive beginning in May and ending the first Sunday in August for the "Maslow Kids." A list of items needed will be available and distributed, and there will be a special collection box for these items in the Sanctuary.

The Maslow Project is a highly successful system of service delivery and outreach for students and their families who are experiencing homelessness. The Maslow Project works hard to address the stigma associated with being homeless. Across Oregon, the number of students who are homeless has increased by 14% since the 2008-2009 school year, according to the state's Department of Education. Over 18,000 students are homeless in Oregon. Medford, the largest city in So. Oregon, has the second highest ratio of homeless to housed students in the state.

The Maslow Project receives a blend of federal, state, and local funding. In the first year they served sixty children and youth. By the third year they served over two thousand, ages 0 to 22. But this funding isn't enough to help with all their needs.

The Maslow Project is housed in a community center—a critical component of its success. The center does not carry the stigma of being a place only for kids who are homeless. "Kids just want to be normal and don't want to be identified as homeless. If kids feel comfortable, they will access services," says Mary Ferrell, Executive Director and Founder of The Maslow Project.




