



September and October Activities

Due to the extent of repairs, restoration, and constraints of space following the fire involving Zion's Sanctuary, we are unable to plan the regular early Fall activities normally enjoyed this time of year. All is busily being put "back together," and we will resume normal routines as soon as possible.

Members and Friends of Zion,

As all are aware, Zion Lutheran Church became the target of arsonists in the early morning hours of July 5th, 2013. Those misguided souls may have had thoughts of destroying the church building, or the cross standing in front of it.....who knows what the motive may have been....but they failed in every sense of the word. Alert and caring neighbors quickly reported the burst of flames outside the church, and a fortuitously close City of Medford Fire Department responded immediately. The fire was put out before it could cause much destruction – yes, the Sanctuary was heavily damaged and yes, the cross was completely engulfed in flame and all but totally destroyed, but God's hand was clearly there – and the destruction that might have been.....wasn't..

But that is not the entire story to be told!

The Sanctuary will take some time for restoration to be completed – but it will be good as new, or even better, as the old roof must be replaced along with the carpeting, and everything will have to be painted inside and out. And the cross that they tried to destroy by fire? A new cross will stand in its place.....but the burnt one has been saved in order that it might be used to show that this symbol of Jesus Christ and the salvation he died to give cannot be destroyed by mere arsonists.

In these weeks after the fire, Zion has been blessed to see the entire Rogue Valley community- both religious and secular - stand together in support of Zion – offering prayer, hymnals and helping hands; sending and bringing donations of money in support of our recovery from the fire damage. Surely THAT was not anything the arsonists had in mind when they set the cross and building on fire!

Zion's Fireside Room is serving wonderfully as a temporary Sanctuary for Sunday Worship Service, providing opportunity for worship in a slightly cozier, more intimate setting. At this writing, the contractors have removed the old roof, prepped for the new roof and should begin putting on the new shingles any time now. Carpet and paint have been chosen for the interior of the Sanctuary—and ordered—so, we are well on the way to recovery. The latest word from the contractor is that—barring the unexpected—we could be back in the Sanctuary for Worship by Thanksgiving.



Pray for America

Spiritual Reflections

The following writing is an excerpt from a booklet entitled <u>40 Days with Jesus</u> by Sarah Young. Presented in the 'voice' of Jesus, she offers this as a tool to help deepen your relationship with God.

Peace is My continual gift to you. It flows abundantly from My throne of grace. Just as the Israelites could not store up manna for the future but had to gather it daily, so it is with My Peace. The day-by-day collecting of manna kept My people aware of their dependence on Me. Similarly, I give you sufficient Peace for the present, when you come to me by prayer and petition with thanksgiving. If I gave you permanent Peace, independent of My Presence, you might fall into the trap of self-sufficiency. May that never be!
